

With Spring on its way we start to think about getting out to walk in the beautiful English countryside again, but where to find new and interesting walks?

Walking in Wiltshire <u>https://www.walkinginengland.co.uk/wiltshire</u> has loads of walks to download and print, free, it also has books of walks, details of all the walking groups in the county and much more. Whether you want to walk on your own or with a group all the information is there in one place.

John Harris (who maintains the website) said 'There is so much walking information on the web but it is difficult to find. Walking in Wiltshire (part of the Walking in England website) has brought it together in one place so whether you are walking from home, or away on holiday, you will be able to find a walk suitable for you'.

With walks from half a mile to twelve miles plus long, and a note of suitability for pushchairs and wheelchairs, everyone can find a walk to enjoy.

On Politics and Religion

It is sometimes said that politics and religion shouldn't mix. Over the years in my role as a local religious representative I've sometimes been advised to stay out of local politics. In recent weeks I have felt challenged by watching people with no religious commitment suggest political interventions in the life of my faith community.

Yet I have always believed that politics and religion can't be separated. A moral choice or action may be private within your own home but it becomes political as soon as you act based on your own moral code out in society.

For example your food choices are private, but if (like me) you can't drink milk and live in a community with several dairy farms, you become very aware that this private choice may have a social impact and outcome.

I'm part of a church which enjoys enormous privileges because of its historic establishment as the national church. This privilege continues into the present with Bishops in the House of Lords and a very entangled legal system between church and state.

There is a danger that I may like political "interference" when it aligns with my views and dislike it when it doesn't. And, of course, for any group of "insiders" there can be frustrations when "outsiders" don't 'get' the realities of my church (or club or class or interest group).

I should declare my interest here. I am a member of the Campaign for Equal Marriage*. Yet I am aware that I am in a minority within the Church of England and that I have priestly friends and colleagues whom I respect and value who see things very differently.

I believe that those who disagree with me are also people who care deeply about our shared faith and I am aware that all of us will be seeking to serve and care for people in our congregations and communities who may be hurt by the expression of our different views. This awareness has been part of my ministry as an ordained woman who remains part of a church where there are bishops, clergy and church members who do not think that women can be ordained. Over the years I have learned so much from maintaining working relationships with people I will never agree with – and we have served our communities better by working together on shared goals.

A willingness to work together without seeking full agreement may be a way of navigating a world in which politics and religion often seem to bring conflict and in this way we may find we are practising a golden rule on which almost all faiths and those of no faith agree.

REVISION OF CHURCH ELECTORAL ROLL Notice is hereby given that the Church Electoral Roll of the above parish will be revised by the Parochial Church Council*, beginning on the 11th day of February 2023, The revision must be and ending on the 26th day of February 2023. completed at least 15 days, but no more than 28 days, before the Annual Parochial Church After the revision, a copy of the Roll will be published by the Parochial Meetina. Church Council In the Church Notice Board by the gate at the entrance of the Church for at least 14 days and a copy of the Roll will be available for inspection on a reasonable request being made to the Council. Under the Church Representation Rules any lay persons are entitled to have their names entered on the roll if the person is-(a) is baptised. (b) is aged 16 or over, and (c) has made one of the following three declarations and duly applied for enrolment. The first declaration is that the person is a member of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with it and is resident in the parish. The second declaration is that the person is a member of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with it, is not resident in the parish, but has habitually attended public worship in the parish during the preceding six months. The third declaration is that the person is a member in good standing of a Church which is not in communion with the Church of England but subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity and is also a member of the Church of England and has habitually attended public worship in the parish during the preceding six months. Application Forms for enrolment can be obtained from the Church Electoral Roll Officer. In order for a person to be entitled to attend the annual parochial church meeting and to take part in its proceedings, an Application Form for enrolment must be returned by the date shown above for the ending of the revision of the Church Electoral Roll by the Parochial Church Council. Any error discovered in the Roll should at once be reported to the Church Electoral Roll Officer. At least 14 days notice must be given.
